



- These events united diverse stakeholders, reinforcing our shared commitment to workforce development.





# Industry Sector Summits by the Numbers




## **Education Summit Representation:**

### Round Two Sub Award Project Applications - Awards Announced

The WE Will! K16 Collaborative opened a call for a second round of sub-award project applications on August 30, 2024, offering \$4.2 million to support innovative new projects. By the October 1st deadline, an impressive 35 applications had been submitted, reflecting the continued enthusiasm for advancing education-to-career pathways across the region.

## Rigorous Review and Selection Process

The Design Team conducted a thorough review and scored all applications, meeting on October 10th to identify high-impact projects for funding. The Design Team's recommendation for funding was presented to the Executive Steering Council at the October 24th convening, where it was upheld.

### **Funding Results**

We are excited to announce that 21 projects will be funded in Round Two, representing 60% of total submissions.
Significantly, 12 of these projects are first-time subaward recipients, underscoring our commitment to fostering new and diverse initiatives.

### **Empowering Emergency Responders: EMT Training** and Education

This initiative is designed to equip future emergency responders with the skills and knowledge they need to serve our community. Upon completion of our one-semester program, our students will be equipped to take and pass the certification exam to become employed or continue their education in paramedic or fire.

Our project has already achieved significant milestones. We have successfully engaged local employers and training sites in preparation for our first cohort, set to launch in spring 2025. Additionally, we have secured an instructional ambulance to simulate real-world emergency scenarios, enhancing the hands-on learning experience for our students.

# Bridging Educational Paths: A Collaborative Initiative by CSU Stanislaus & Modesto City Schools

Bridging Educational Pathways is a collaborative initiative between Modesto City Schools and CSU Stanislaus, spearheaded by Dr. Ana York. The program is dedicated to recruiting BIPOC students and creating a supportive pathway into the teaching profession for high school and college students through the Educators Rising and Aspiring Educators programs. Educators Rising is a program designed for middle and high school students, offering early exposure to careers in education. On the other hand, Aspiring Educators supports undergraduate and preservice teacher candidates at the collegiate level.

The Educators Rising program launched in Spring 2023 with a chapter at Modesto High School, consisting of two lead teachers and three students. By Fall 2023, the program had grown, welcoming 30 students with the addition of another lead teacher from the CTE Education Pathway. Spring 2024 marked significant milestones, including 45 students' campus visit to CSU Stanislaus and a senior recognition ceremony, where future educators received certificates for their commitment to the teaching profession. The summer brought even more inspiration, as 42 students and chaperones attended the National Educators Rising Conference in Washington, D.C., with CSU Stanislaus students serving as mentors.
